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Introductory note

The role of religion in the struggle for Israel/Palestine is one of the most interested, but also highly actual, discussed but controversial issues. Nonetheless, this increased and often ideologically motivated interest has generated many problems in choosing relevant texts for the scientific study of the issue. The big exposure and high polarity of publications about Israel/Palestine is a serious problem especially for beginners, e.g. students and young researchers, who often fail to distinguish sufficiently between scientifically supported and impartial studies and texts of ideological propaganda many times written in the language of crypto-science. Another problem is also a huge corpus of various texts regarding about this issue. Indeed, this bibliography is far from being fully comprehensive with regard to this extensively elaborated topic on about this extensively elaborated topic but it has aimed to keep up with within the realms of possibility, a representative and balanced one.

The main goal is to offer a balanced, representative and a relatively comprehensive selection of secondary scientific texts (especially monographs, books, edited volumes, journal articles, bibliographies, atlases, encyclopaedias, edited documents and academic theses) that were written about the role of the several religions (mainly Judaism, Islam and Christianity, but also of religion of some minority communities in the region as the Druze, Samaritan etc.) in the struggle for Israel/Palestine, without including the primary sources (except o some selected published edited documents). The bibliography is divided into five sections: The first part issues bibliographies related to Israel/Palestine, the second one contains some important published documents or collections of documents related to the issue. The third part includes some interested and inspirational academic theses, the forth one is a lists monographs, books, edited volumes, journal articles, and the final part focuses on atlases and encyclopaedias. The main profile of the selection was the relevancy of texts for the research in the field of the study of religions in the struggle for Israel/Palestine. The academic study of religions is a scientific discipline which is not defined by its primary method, but by the area of interest. Thus resulting in a bibliography containing a multidisciplinary cross-section of publications. It is a compilation of texts from the field of Jewish, Christian and Islamic Studies, Comparative religion, History, Anthropology, Psychology, Social and Political Sciences, Urban and conflict studies, Media studies, History of Arts and Architecture, Oriental studies, etc. According to the time horizon of the selected textual sources, we are at disposal of the publications written in about the last one hundred years, to be more accurate in the period of 1927-2023. With regard to the choice of languages, it contains especially texts published in English, but there are several representative titles written in other western languages (German, French, Italian, etc.), as well as some key publications published in Arabic and Hebrew. For these

items, the data is listed in the Latin transcription. In order to highlight the local central European academic production, the bibliography does not miss the original work written in Slovak, Czech, and Hungarian. However, I have not included translations from foreign languages, all publications can be found in the bibliography in the original release language. In the case of records written in non-western and central European languages (Arabic, Hebrew, Slovak, Czech and Hungarian) besides the original title, an English translation is always amended.

Regarding the order of individual items, they are ranked by the English alphabet. In the case of the authors with "surnames" starting with the Arabic determiner "Al-" (or its variants), these are alphabetically ranked regardless of this determiner. It also applies to Hebrew "Ha-" and English "The". Others, especially "classic" Arabic authors, are shed under their *nasab* "Ibn ...", in the case of Hebrew names "Ben". For the transcription of Arabic and Hebrew I used a simplified transcription, common in the English context. The websites listed in the have been lastly active on November 1st 2023 (unless indicated otherwise).

This selected bibliography on the role of religion in the struggle for Israel/Palestine can be used not only by students but also by junior and senior researchers not only from the field of Comparative religion, but also by historians, anthropologists, political scientists, orientalist, etc. / or by experts from practice, e.g. diplomats, members of humanitarian and peace organizations, the security and armed forces or intelligence.

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
